shops & eateries

Though Sammamish has limited shopping within its borders, its proximity to Issaquah, Redmond, and Bellevue offer a plethora of options. Pine Lake Village shopping center, the Sammamish Highlands, or Inglewood Plaza at 228th Avenue NE and NE 8th Street/NE Inglewood Hill Road.

Within a short away, Issaquah offers the Issaquah Highlands, Issaquah Commons, and downtown shopping centers. Nearby, Redmond offers the Redmond Towncenter, the Bella Bottega Shopping Center, and downtown boutique shopping.

Further west, Bellevue offers the Bellevue Commons, the Bellevue Collection, Bellevue Square Mall, Factoria Mall, Overlake Plaza, and Crossroads Mall.



The city of Sammamish is located east of Lake Sammamish, west of the Snoqualmie Valley, south of Redmond, and north of I-90.

Sammamish's many neighborhoods include Adelaide, Beaver Lake, Inglewood, Klahanie, Mint Grove, Pine Lake, Plateau, Providence Point, and Sahalee.

Most buses running through the City of Sammamish, run along 228th Avenue Southeast, and include Metro routes 216, 219, and 269, though the South Sammamish Park & Ride also offers route 554 by Sound Transit.

Via Issaquah to the south and Redmond to the north, residents enjoy access to Interstate 90 and Highway 520 respectively. These freeways offer easy commutes into Redmond, Bellevue, Issaquah, Seattle and beyond.

Though the Light Rail Eastlink doesn't pass through Sammamish, there are two future opportunities with both the Issaquah and Redmond extensions. The South Transit route 554 also gets reviewed annually.
