The city of Shoreline, with its proximity to the city of Seattle, abundant local resources, and beautiful views, is an ideal place to live. There are 404 acres of park lands located within the Shoreline city limits.

Residents and visitors can enjoy the saltwater shoreline, a botanical garden, an interurban trail plus hiking trails, along with recently updated athletic fields, courts and playgrounds.

Shoreline encompasses 11.74 square miles and has a population of 53,000+ residents.

Richmond Beach is the northernmost portion of the City of Shoreline, located along Puget Sound.

Its community association prides itself on being “...one of the most inviting, vibrant, scenic, involved and “event-full” neighborhoods in the region.”

The Richmond Beach Saltwater Park, with its scenic walking trails, picnic shelters, and “playground with a view”, is a draw for local residents and visitors alike.

Just north of Innis Arden and south of the outer reaches of Edmonds, Richmond Beach offers an enviable community-filled lifestyle.




SHORELINE & RICHMOND BEACH *activities*

The **Interurban Trail** is a 3 mile trail that runs parallel to Aurora Avenue with access to Aurora Village and Shoreline Park & Ride. Two pedestrian bridges are not only utilitarian, they are also part of the public art located on the trail. The "rail-to-shore" concrete patterning on both bridges celebrates Shoreline's history and proximity to the water.

Richmond Beach Saltwater Park offers breathtaking views, convenient water access and abundant trails. Its Reflex Solaris, an interactive concrete and steel sundial with five stainless steel reflectors, is built into the park's upper slopes. These reflectors will cast images of the environmental features surrounding them, including the sunlight, clouds, moonlight and Olympic Mountain views. People who stand on the sundial at designated spots can look toward the east at the hillside to see the steel reflectors along the True North, Solstice and Equinox lines.

Shoreview Park is home to the city's only year round off-leash dog park. It also contains wooded nature areas with trails, picnic tables, play grounds, restrooms, soccer fields, tennis courts and baseball/softball fields. Shoreview Park features plentiful parking and offers a beautiful view of the Olympic Mountains.




SHORELINE

Shoreline is located north of Seattle, west of Lake Forest Park and south of Edmonds.

Neighborhoods of Shoreline include Ballinger, Echo Lake, Evergreen, Highland Terrace, Hillwood, Innis Arden, North City, Parkwood, Richmond Beach, Ridgecrest, Ronald, and Spring Beach.

Access to Seattle via major arterials is typically via Highway 99 or Interstate 5.

Shoreline has public transportation, some bike lanes and most activities are car dependent.

The King County Metro, Sound Transit, and South Transit's light rail system run through Seattle, as well as neighborhood-specific systems, such as the South Lake Union rail, the famous monorail connecting downtown and Seattle center, and an integrated ferry system.

Interstate-5 runs North-South through Seattle, while Interstate-90 and State Route 520 intersect in Central District and Eastlake neighborhoods, respectfully.
